#### Start Your Own (lassroom Herb Garden:

#### **Sensory Herbs:**

<u>Touch</u> - lamb's ear, wooly thyme, silver sage, yarrow, and coneflowers

Sight - marigolds, sage (purple, Russian, and pineapple), verbena, nasturtiums, lady's mantle, angelica, lavender, sunflowers, and roses

<u>Taste -</u> chives, basil, dill, parsley, cilantro, fennel, nasturtiums, pineapple sage, mints (apple, peppermint, spearmint), salad burnet, stevia, oregano, anise and thyme

<u>Hearing - Herbs</u> such as sage, nasturtiums, and bee balm attract buzzing bees, chattering birds, and hummingbirds

<u>Smell - lavender, lemon balm, lemon thyme, lemon verbena, roses, scented geraniums, mints</u> (peppermint, pineapple), sages, and anise

Easy to Start from seeds: yarrow, mint, basil, marigolds, chives, catmint, lemon balm, thyme, dill

Good in Containers: basil, chives, mint, rosemary, thyme, lemon balm, geraniums
