LIVING HISTORY WEEKENDS

Visitors will learn about life between 1890-1910 by engaging with costumed History Interpreters in the Victorian Village. A variety of different people, technologies, lifestyles and cultures will be on display. Discover how life in the Rockford region has changed over the last 125+ years, and also how life has stayed the same. Living History Weekends will often feature a unique historical emphasis, with a focus on different technologies, activities and historical elements. Check our website for details before your visit. **Admission to Living History Weekends includes entrance to the Main Museum Center exhibits.**

* Living History Weekends begin on **Saturday, May 6** and run through **Monday, September 4**. Hours are 10am - 4pm on Saturdays, and Noon - 4pm on Sundays. Please note that on Saturday, August 5 our schedule and pricing will change for **Tipsy History: The Roaring Twenties**. The Village will be open from 1 - 9pm for this unique event.

Beginning **Saturday, September 9** and running through **Sunday, October 29**, the Victorian Village will be open for tours by costumed History Interpreters. On Saturdays, tours will begin on the hour from 11am - 3pm. On Sundays, tours will begin on the hour from Noon - 3pm.

ABOUT US

Victorian Village

Our 148-acre museum campus includes a living history village representing a rural community during the era of 1890-1910, with 26 structures and 8 heritage gardens. From May to September, the Victorian Village is open for tours with costumed History Interpreters. Living History Weekends offer visitors an immersive experience, engaging with interpreters in multiple buildings with demonstrations of life during the Victorian era.

History Education Programs

Eight enchanting gardens envelop you in the rich history of Victorian horticulture. Private garden tours uncover the mysteries of 19th century garden design and the legacy of heirloom planting. The Historic Iris Preservation Garden is a collection of rare irises dating from the 1500s to 1910, with tours during the early spring bloom.

COMING SOON - You're in the Army Now: Camp Grant, Rockford's Legacy

We have kicked off our capital campaign to build a new permanent exhibit telling the story of Rockford's Camp Grant, where over 300,000 soldiers trained to defend our nation in World Wars I and II.

Many Faces, One Community

This exhibit features stories of Rockford's immigrants from 1834 to the present. Arrive through the train depot, stroll along 7th and South Main Streets, visit an immigrant home, and apply for a job at the Swedish furniture factory.

Queen City of the Prairies

Only 20 years after its founding, Rockford became an important regional center of government, industry and commerce. Learn more about life in 1840s Rockford.

The Girls of Summer

Meet the famous Rockford Peaches and learn about the storied ladies who played hardball in the 1940s-50s.

The Missing Link: Socks, Monkeys and Rockford's Industrial Past

View the Nelson knitting machines and learn about the red heel socks that earned Rockford the title of "Home of the Sock Monkey."

Flight Gallery

Learn about pioneering local aviators like Dr. Bessica Raiche, and see the restored 1920 SMI Stinson-Detroiter airplane named "Greater Rockford" that Col. Bert "Fish" Hassell flew in the failed first attempt at the Great Circle Route from Rockford to Stockholm.

Industrial Gallery

Rockford's industrial geniuses created innovative products that impacted the local and worldwide economy.

Old Doll's House Museum

Outside the Museum Center, the Old Doll's House Museum has 30 miniature homes representing different countries.

Woodward Millhouse

Tour an 1860s recreated mill with a functioning waterwheel.
